The goal of the Student Research Symposium is to give students early in their careers the opportunity to present talks on work in progress to an experienced research audience composed of AAAM members and conference attendees from diverse disciplines. The symposium seeks presentations on works in progress, methods papers, and smaller studies. Abstracts are sought in all areas of traffic-related injury prevention and control including automotive medicine, behavioral research science, biomechanics, engineering, epidemiology, statistics, education, law, and public policy. We strongly encourage students to continue to submit completed studies of a scope equivalent to a peer-reviewed journal publication for consideration for presentation at the main conference.

TRAVEL STIPENDS | The presenter of all abstracts selected for presentation at the Student Symposium will have the registration fee to the main conference waived and will receive a travel stipend of up to \$1300 USD to attend the conference.
